Here's a list of some of the more notable things that we've been working on:

- A multi-municipal overlay district that will improve the consistency and effectiveness of existing land use ordinances
- Building the EDS organization to include a coalition of many communities and organizations around a shared interest in the redevelopment of our commercial corridors (Route 51, Brownsville Road, and Streets Run Road), while supporting the numerous smaller commercial areas within our neighborhoods.
- Better marketing the area through a new regional branding campaign that will include unified signage, banners, and website. This effort will help potential businesses and residents to see the many positive things going on in our communities, making us a more attractive destination.
- Working to improve the accessibility of our communities. Our communities will be increasingly competitive as gas prices rise and long commutes become less desirable. However, while we are very proximate to regional employment centers downtown and in Greentree, we are not very accessible to these areas. This effort includes increasing access to transit and improving traffic flows.
- A multi-municipal Environmental Committee. This group will serve as a Shade Tree commission, planting trees and maintaining existing ones, and a lot greening group, prioritizing greening sites and building a network of volunteers around the area to clean-up and beautify these sites.
- A façade and sign grant program. This initiative will make available matching grants for existing businesses who want to beautify their properties (new signs, new awnings, etc.).

And many more programs and initiatives that I hope to share with you in coming months
